#### Reasons for using smartphones in the classroom

- Promotes creativity with English language learning.
- Links the world outside with the classroom as a shared virtual space encourages communication among students when not in class.
- Motivation factors students are rarely seen without a phone in their hands!

#### Reasons for using smartphones in the classroom (cont.)

 Gives teachers a sample of freer language production - enables us to see if students are producing the language correctly. e.g. after a particular grammar point.

Can be used for error correction - anonymous so students don't feel embarrassed to make mistakes.

Creates a communal space where students can interact together and with their teacher.






