





The article outlines a number of benefits brought from e mployee and employer . For individual, having a good work-life balance is a obvious benefit of telework, such as employees will have a conventional workplace and work hours. For company, the productivity will be improved with the increasing satisfaction of employees and the financial advantages are clear. Furthermore, there is also a reduction of expenses which is a significant mutually beneficial point for both of them.

Despite the advantages of telecommuting, the author also states several elements that are about negative impacts. First and foremost, it's not suitable for everyone. So appropriate people must be chosen by company. The second, the kind of task also **play plays** a important role in telework. Moreover, telecommuting **have has** the necessary equipment to do the job. Considered all of them by author, working at home may cause feeling of isolation and it may cause more stress for workers without critics.

The author hold the view that the prevalence of telecommuting will continue to grow and experimentation is necessary.
