### Basic Principles: some of them

- "1. Creativity is the natural order of life. Life is energy: pure creative energy.
- 2. There is an underlying, in-dwelling creative force infusing all of life including ourselves.
- 3. When we open ourselves to our creativity, we open ourselves to the creator's creativity within us and our lives.
- 4. We are ourselves, creations. And we in turn, are meant to continue creativity by being creative ourselves." Cameron (1995)

# The Pages

- Stream of consciousness writing 2-3 pages
- Mental 'junk' out
- Clarity of mind
- Emotional charge removed
- Allows for action

# Teacher applications

- Do the pages
- Assists in clarity
- Goals clarified
- Priorities ordered
- New ideas flow

### Other applications

- Safety: support network
- Possibilities: experiment with new/different ideas
- Self-care: nurturing, nutrition and adequate rest
- Connection: making alliances to generate positive energy/ideas
- Rewards/positive self talk

#### Student activities

- ▶ The pages: stream of consciousness writing
- Oral presentation: someone they admire
- Self-awareness: VARK & Myers Briggs
- Self-care: nutrition/rest/exercise

#### Student activities continued

- Rewards for doing things well/completion
- Positive self-talk
- Music for motivation
- Art gallery Oral presentation

#### Conclusion

- Injects new ideas both for the teacher and the student
- Facilitates the teachers understanding of their current cohort
- Strengthens engagement
- Promotes self-awareness and understanding
- Be willing to try new things and use different approaches
